<p>SCIENCE Animals, including humans: Teeth, Digestive System, Food chains Describe the simple functions of the basic parts of the digestive system in humans. Identify the different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions. Construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey.
