

Year 4 Newsletter Term 3 Spring 1

Tombs and Treasures- Ancient Egypt

Welcome back! This term our topic is 'Tombs and Treasures'. We will be reading Ma'ats Feather, a story about a young boy who is born into a farming family in Ancient Egypt.



English

In our English lessons, we will be discovering facts and writing a non-chronological report about Ancient Egypt. We will be reading Ma'ats Feather, a story of an 8 year Egyptian boy, and we will be meeting the author. Also, we will read the story 'Heart and the Bottle', create character descriptions and retell the story. We will be continuing to focus on cursive handwriting, common spelling patterns and grammar. In addition, there will be a focus on using English across the curriculum to further develop our writing skills.

Maths

In Maths, we will continue to recall number facts for multiplication and division during lessons, as well as, our daily times table practice. Children will be learning how to measure perimeter as well as convert units of measure for length, e.g. 5km = 5000m. We will also be using and applying these skills in different contexts, such as solving word problems. Also, continuing to use the four operations in mental and written calculations.

Science

In Science, we will be looking at sound. We will be identifying how sounds are made and how they travel. We will be working scientifically to find patterns between the pitch of a sound and the features of the object that produced it, also between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it. We will also investigate how a sound changes as the distance from the source increases. We will be making our own creative sounds with Kim, our music teacher, every Wednesday.

Topic

Our main topic focus will be History. We will be finding out about Ancient Egypt and looking at a range of artefacts to help us understand more about the lifestyle of that time. This will include learning about the pyramids, burials, gods and mummification.

In addition, we will be learning design techniques for sculpture with a range of materials. We will be designing a cartouche, writing in hieroglyphics and creating canopic jars. In preparation for this, please can you start collecting glass jars, as children will need to bring one in.

During E-Safety, we will be learning how to protect ourselves by discussing what is public and private information. We will also identify whether to go for help and support when they have concerns about the content or communication/contact.

In R.E we will be learning about Sikhism.

In SRE children will be learning about puberty and how their body and emotions may change as they develop.

P.E

This term, we will be learning key skills such as coordination and static balance. Both classes will have a PE session every Wednesday with Fit For Sport, where they will be learning the skills required to play hockey. Please make sure your child has appropriate kit (trainers, black, blue or grey jogging bottoms, a white t-shirt and a jumper). This needs to be separate to their school uniform (and is not worn underneath their school uniform). Please make sure your child has their name written in all of their clothing.

Home learning

Home Learning will be issued on a Friday and due back in the following Wednesday. Your child will have one piece of English homework, one piece of Maths homework and spellings each week. They will also be given a topic based project to complete throughout the term. It is really important that children are practising times tables at home, because these form the foundations for much of the Maths work we are doing in class. Children are expected to be able to randomly recall their times tables up to 12x12 by the end of Year 4. Please support your child in working towards this.
