

WALT make a puppet theatre to retell Jim and the Beanstalk.

In English we are reading the story 'Jim and the Beanstalk' by Raymond Briggs.

We are going to retell the story using puppets.



How to make a puppet theatre

You will need:

A cereal or shoe box

A pair of scissors

Paper or card

Colouring pencils or paints

A pencil, stick or straw for the puppet

Glue or tape



Instructions:

1. Get an old cereal or shoe box.
2. If using a cereal box, cut a large rectangle shape out of the middle of the box. **Ask an adult to start you off.** I made it look like there were curtains but you can actually just do this with paper or even fabric later on.



3. Cut a straight line out of the top of the box. **Ask an adult to start you off.** You might want to make it slightly wider so it fits a pencil but still holds it. I did mine in the middle but it might be better closer to the back of the box.



4. Draw the setting of the story. You could draw a beanstalk, clouds in the sky, the giants castle etc. Or you could make them 3D, like my beanstalk.



5. Decorate the outside of the theatre. You could paint it or stick on paper curtains, like mine. If you have any spare fabric, it would look great stuck on like curtains here.



6. Draw a picture of Jim on card or paper (I used the card that I cut out from my cereal box)



7. Cut around the outline of Jim.
8. Tape or stick him standing upwards at the end of a pencil, stick or straw.



9. Carefully put him through the line you have cut in the top.
10. Voila! You have your Jim and the Beanstalk puppet theatre!



You might want to stick your theatre to some cardboard or something on the base to help to keep it still when you are moving your puppets.

If you do not have the bits and bobs to make a theatre. Draw a picture of Jim, the beanstalk and the castle. Cut them out separately and tape or stick each of them to a pencil. There you have your puppets!



Why not practise moving Jim up and down the beanstalk by moving your pencil up and down?

Keep any scraps of card. We may need to make another puppet and more props as we read on through the story...
