Hmmm. I've heard this story before, or have I? Ah no, it's **Jim**, not Jack, this time.

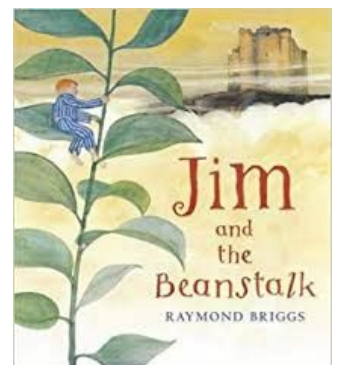

- What do you think will be at the top of the beanstalk?
- Who do you think Jim will meet there?
- What do you think will happen when they meet?
- How do you think the story will end?





You can write your answers in your purple book. Remember to write in full sentences. For example:

I think there will be a castle at the top of the beanstalk.
