Exclamation Marks Look out! Stop! I'll blow your house down! Wow! That's amazing! Leave me alone!

- An exclamation mark is used when something is surprising, exciting or forceful.
- It helps make the meaning of the sentence clear.
- It replaces a full stop at the end of the sentence.
