Imperative verbs (bossy verbs)

sit down	stand up	line up
put	stir	add
hold	join	fix
swing	jump	shake

- A command sentence is a sentence that tells someone to do something.
- Commands usually start with an 'imperative verb' also called a 'bossy verb' because it tells someone to do something.
- We use commands when we are writing instructions.

Line up at the door.

Stir in the sugar.

Stomp your feet.

Can you follow my instructions to complete the dance routine?

1. **Move** your right foot forward and back.
2. Move your left foot forward and back.
3. Jump to the right.
4. Jump to the left.
5. Place your left foot over your right foot and spin around clockwise!
