WALT spell regular **simple past tense** verbs using the -ed suffix.

Present	Past
jump	jumped
climb	climbed
paint	painted

- We use the **simple present tense** when we talk about something that is happening now.
- We use the **simple past tense** when we talk about something that has already happened.

Look at the **simple present** and **simple past tense** verbs above.



What is the same about them?

What is different?

For a lot of **simple past tense** verbs, we just add the **-ed** suffix to the end of the root word. For some verbs, like jump, it sounds like a /t/ sound but it is written **-ed**.
