WALT write a riddle in the role of a fairy tale character.



Do you remember what a **riddle** is?

You wrote an excellent **riddle** about an animal last term.

Who is my favourite fairy tale character? Read the **riddle** to find out!

I wear a red cape.

My dad has a sharp axe.

My dear, old granny lives in the woods.

I will never trust a wolf again!

Who am I?







Correct! It is Little Red Riding Hood.

A **riddle** describes someone or something without saying who or what it is. I have written my **riddle** in the **first person** using 'I'. This means I am pretending to be the character.



Use your ideas from yesterday to write a **riddle** pretending that you are your favourite fairy tale character but don't write who you are!

Remember to:

- use your **sounds** to help you spell the words 
- use a **finger space** between each word 
- use a **capital letter** to start each sentence and **full stop** at the end  
- write each sentence on a **new line**
- use **adjectives** (describing words)
- write 'Who am I?' at the end of your riddle



When you have finished writing, ask someone to help you read back through your work and check that you have included all the things above.
