The British Hotel

However, Mary Seacole was determined to go and funded her own trip to the Crimea where she set up her own hospital which she named the British Hotel. Here she worked to look after sick and injured soldiers with the help of money from people she knew and the assistance from her maid Sally.

She became known as 'Mother Seacole' and was highly regarded by the soldiers. She didn't care which side a soldier was fighting, she treated all injured soldiers.

Herbal Remedies

In the British Hotel, Mary Seacole used the herbal remedies she'd learned from her mother to treat the sick and injured. As the usual medicines were not always easily available, this was extremely useful.

She would make the medicines herself with a pestle and mortar, heating them over a fire. Some are still used today.

(mixed to heal cuts and wounds)

Lemon Grass

(boiled to help fever)

Ginger

(ground to help diarrhoea)

Lemons

(mixed to help coughs)

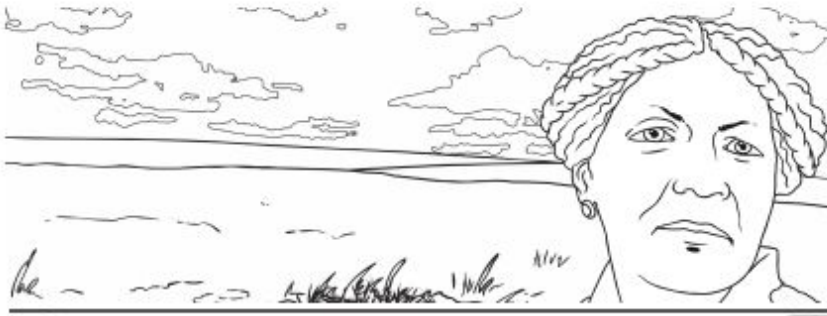
Okra

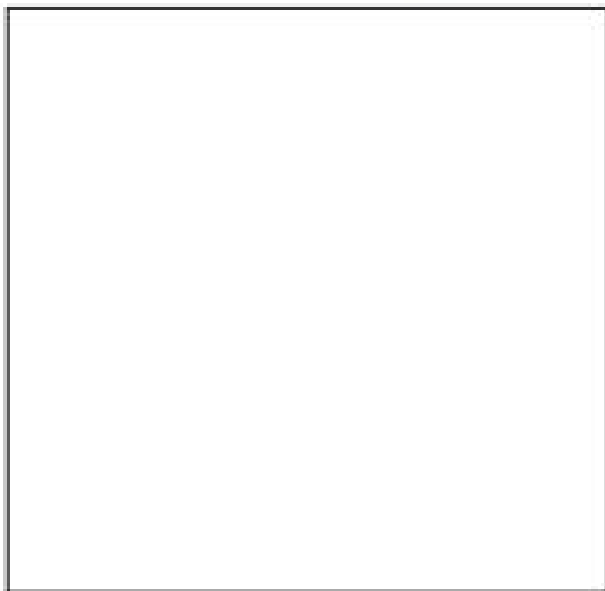
