

**Learn at Home with now>press>play!**

now>press>play is an immersive audio resource that engages primary school children in the curriculum through emotion, imagination and movement. Immersed in sound, your child will become the main character in a story, meeting people, discovering places and solving problems on an educational adventure they'll never forget!

**How does it work?**

1. Get four pieces of paper and write the compass points: North, South, East, West. Stick them on the four walls of the room.
2. You can either listen to the audio out loud or through headphones.
3. Now Press Play!
4. Follow the instructions in the story.

**What do we do after the audio adventure?**

1. Discussion - use the Experience Guide or ask your own questions such as: 'what was your favourite part? How did it make you feel?'
2. Complete the follow-on activities and worksheets.
3. Follow your child's interests - perhaps they want to draw, reenact a scene, write a newspaper report...the world is your oyster!

**Top tips:**

- Your now>press>play Experience will be enhanced if you can use wireless headphones / earbuds.
- You will equally have fun if you play it out loud.
- Join in - it's fun to do together!

Click on the Year 1 and 2 tab and then history and then castles.

Press the purple play button and listen and enjoy the experience!

After the experience complete the following task in your book

Invitation - Feasting, Fun and Frolics! The King is so grateful to you for returning the crown that there is to be a banquet in your honour to celebrate. There will be fine food, minstrels, singing and dancing. Design an invitation for all the knights, lords and ladies of the land so that they can join in the feasting and fun!
