Write a Paragraph

- A paragraph should focus on one main idea. Every sentence in the paragraph needs to support the main idea.
- A paragraph should have a beginning, middle, and end.

Think of a paragraph like a sandwich:



The top piece of bread is the opening sentence, or the topic sentence, of the paragraph. It tells the reader what the paragraph is about.

The lettuce, tomato, cheese, and meat are the supporting sentences. They give more details about the topic sentence. They support the details that the opening sentence has started.

The bottom piece of bread is the closing sentence. It tells the reader what the paragraph is about and why it is important.

- A new paragraph should be indented.
- You write a new paragraph when you are changing ideas.
- There is not a rule about how many sentences should be in a paragraph, but in general, a student usually writes 4 to 8 sentences.

make a guitar


You will need:

- A wooden box
- Cardboard tape from a kitchen roll
- Sticky tape
- Saw or scissors
- PVA glue
- Cardboard for the plate
- Glue
- Saw or large utility knife

1. Cut a hole in the top of the wooden box, to fit the cardboard tape. Then cut a large hole in the side face of the wooden box. This is where the strings are going to go.
2. Fit the cardboard tape into the hole in the top of the wooden box. Glue it in with PVA glue.
3. Use a saw or large utility knife to cut a groove in the wood for about the same distance as the hole. Fit the strip of saw cardboard on the inside face, leaving them with glue on the outside only. You need to cover the whole face, including the cardboard tape string hole.
4. Repeat the same process for the other side of the wooden box.

How to Wrap a Present

1. Unroll the wrapping paper with the pattern facing down. Put the gift on the paper and make sure there is enough to cover all the sides, top and bottom.



Tip
When you fold the paper up at the ends, it must reach about 2cm over half way.
