Now it's your turn to write amazing narrative poems, but before then let's get you thinking!

This poem is from Michael Rosen's book called 'Centrally Heated Knickers.' Lots of the poems in there are about ordinary objects in life that could take on amazing new qualities. For example, imagine knickers that are centrally heated!

In 'Boogy Woogy Buggy' the buggy sounds like it's dancing to the Jive of the Boogy woogy. What do you think? It is also telling the story of how a baby and a buggy go in and out of shops and drive down different streets and how the baby feels when the wheels bump along the pavement and the air goes through his hair!

**See if you can think of strange or amazing things that these ordinary objects could do...**

*e.g. a sofa*

*The duvet sofa could be as soft as a duvet when you sit on it. Then it has an attachable cover so that you can fold the cover over yourself. Then, wrapped up in the duvet sofa, it would be just like being in bed!*

**Look at the table below and fill in the parts that are empty. Be imaginative about these everyday objects! You will be turning one of these ideas into a poem tomorrow!**
